January 2015

A message from our Chairman

Whatever happened to 2014, the year just seemed to fly by and here we are already into January 2015. It seemed as if just the other day, we were looking forward to a great summer and watching the daffodils and poppies bloom on the earthen mound in Banbury Lane as we either walked or drove into Hunsbury Meadows. Although 2014 seemed to fly by, I am personally very proud of what has been achieved by your Parish Council during the last few months. Some very real and tangible improvements have been secured for the benefit our parishioner's and the overall environment here at Hunsbury Meadows.



We finally installed the second of the VAS speed indication devices in Banbury Lane, helping

to create more speed awareness in passing drivers and improve overall safety. We believe these devices to be a major contributor to reducing speed and ensuring that crossing the road is now generally safer for our school children and our older and more infirm residents. The installation of three new park benches, two high profile litter bins and three additional dog poo bins have been installed on and around the green space in Banbury Lane and they are being used already on a daily basis. We should not forget to mention the new landscape planting and installation of two oak planters as you enter into Hunsbury Meadows from both ends of Banbury Lane. These will be professionally maintained on an ongoing monthly basis from this point on.

New Hunsbury Meadows road signs have been installed in consultation with MGWSP (NCC Highways) to enhance residential recognition of where we live, helping us all to be just a little bit more proud of Hunsbury Meadows, enhancing our image as a compelling residential area in which to live. Your Councillors have also been busy negotiating over several months with the Borough Council and with Enterprise their landscaping contractors to ensure measurable improvements in the quality of grass cutting, hedge trimming and future tree management.

We continue to seek out new Neighborhood Watch coordinators for additional schemes particularly from the Pineham Lock development and the area around Samwell Way.

We were delighted that we had a number of residents who attended our Parish Council meeting in November. We benefited from some lively discussion and a number of local issues were raised. We meet on the first Wednesday of every month with the next meeting falling on February 3rd. You are most welcome to attend and you will have every opportunity to make sure that your Parish Council understands and appreciates the issues that impact on your daily lives living in Hunsbury Meadows. We have suffered from some minor vandalism issues in latter months and the Parish Council are dealing together in with the Police to ensure this is finally stamped out and the culprits suitably dealt with.

Finally your Parish Councillors will need to stand for re-election in May 2015 should they wish to continue to represent you. If you would like to stand as a Councillor for the Parish Council, then this is your opportunity to help make a difference and continue to work to improve the quality of where we live. The local elections will fall on the same day as the General Election for National Government, so a very important day when hopefully everyone at Hunsbury Meadows will exercise their right to vote.

CALL YOUR IN AN EMERGENCY **ALWAYS CALL 999**

WHEN SHOULD I USE 101?

You should call 101 to report crime and other concerns that do not require an emergency response. For example, if:

- Your car has been stolen
- Your property has been damaged
- You suspect drug use or dealing in your neighbourhood
- Report a minor traffic collision
- Give the police information about crime in your area
- Speak to the police about a general enquiry

You should always call 999 when it is an emergency, such as when a crime is in progress, someone suspected of a crime is nearby, when there is danger to life or when violence is being used or threatened.



Trees and Shrubs

The Council is well aware that the height of many established trees throughout the parish, particularly along Banbury Lane, is becoming a problem. The Borough and County Councils are being as helpful as possible in their respective areas, but before too long, action will need to be taken to cut back the trees at high level, which the Parish Council may have to fund.

Meanwhile, could we please ask all home owners who have hedges or shrubs in their gardens which overhang public footways, to please keep them regularly trimmed. Thank you.

The Council has also noticed one or two instances of garden waste being dumped in hedgerows and ditches. We would ask residents to desist from doing this – the brown bins provided by the Council are more than adequate for the purpose. Dumping of grass cuttings, etc. only makes the hedges and ditches look more untidy and even more difficult to manage.

Bus Stops and Services

Following a suggestion from a resident, the Council is considering approaching the Northamptonshire County Council to see whether bus stops can be provided on Upton Valley Way, near to its junction with Banbury Lane, to provide a stopping facility for the bus service (Service No.50/50a) that runs along Upton Valley Way to the Pineham Business Park. This is a regular bus service and would provide an additional bus facility to that provided by the bus that runs along Banbury Lane to Towcester (Service No.87) The Council would like to hear from anyone who would be likely to use this route, so that we can make the case to the County Council. Parish Council Elections

Residents attention is drawn to the fact that next May will see the first opportunity for parishioners to elect their Parish Council. This will be the first available election opportunity since the Council was formed in 2011. All eight seats on the Council are up for election. All existing Councillors and co-opted members must put themselves up for election if they wish to stand again.

Nomination papers will be available in due course through the Borough Council's Website or from Electoral Registration at the Guildhall, either by post or by downloading.

The Council hopes that there will be at least sufficient nominees to fill the vacancies. Hopefully, there will be more nominees than vacancies so that we can have an election.

The Council is entirely non-political so here is the chance for every interested resident to put their names forward to join the Council and to play a part in caring for our community.





Litter Collection

If you have just moved into the Parish, you may be registered at a previous address and require a postal vote in respect of that address, if so contact your previous Local Authority NOW.

Recycling Centre - Sixfields

Bins

We have now funded and installed an additional three dog waste bins and two new litter bins in the Parish. We have also arranged for these to emptied weekly. Please make use of them and help keep Hunsbury Meadows tidy.

2015/16 Parish Council Precept

Your Council has agreed its budget for the forthcoming financial (2015/2016) and has determined a precept (the amount we ask the Borough Council to collect on our behalf) of £14,220. This compares to a precept for the current financial year of £13,820; an increase of just under 3%.

Hunsbury Meadows is, of course, a growing parish, which means that our tax base, year on year, is also growing. The effect of the expansion means that we are able to spread the burden of the precept to include the growing development at Pineham Lock.

Consequently, we anticipate that the Band D Council Tax for the Parish in 2015/2016 will be £29.08, exactly the same as for the current year's figure.

Despite maintaining the precept at the existing level, we have been able to Include, within the Council's budget provisions to upgrade the children's playground, to provide a new Parish sign and to significantly reduce the height of the trees in Banbury Lane.

Vandalism

There has been a recent spate of vandalism in the area ranging from criminal damage to Parish Council benches and theft/removal/destruction of garden ornaments and planters. We have been liaising closely with the Police on this matter and the incidents are currently being investigated. Should any further incidents occur may we remind you as residents to report them to the Police on 101 as soon as they happen, many thanks for your cooperation on this matter.
