FareShare will find and match charities to our store and then help oversee the relationship once it is up and running. FoodCloud is a simple app that supports the day to day donations by letting charities know how much food a store has on any given day.

We hope to donate a wide range of products - bakery, fruit and veg, eggs and even chilled products like meat, ready meals and dairy products. Of course, we can give no guarantee as to what will be available on any given day.

# **Eric Young**

Walkers along the canal towpath will have noticed a plaque has been sited on the milepost marking two miles from Gayton Junction, a short distance above Lock 14 now generally known as Pineham Lock.

Eric who died on New Years Day 2015 was a stalwart of IWA Northampton Branch. The milepost and Plaque were professionally cast, and David Wilson Homes contributed £300 to the project. The installation was carried out by Arm Adoption Group volunteers and the expertise of The Milestone Society ensured the milepost was positioned correctly.

# **Litter Pick**

The Council is arranging another litter pick for the autumn and has selected Saturday 1st October as the date. Please assemble in the children's playground on

Banbury Lane at 10.30am. Gloves and litter pickers will be provided. The more people who come along, the greater the area we can cover and the quicker it will take.

# **Speed Survey**

The most common complaint made to the Parish Council concerns traffic speeding along Banbury Lane. Many drivers are apparently oblivious to the 30mph speed limit, or just don't care. Consequently, with the support of Northamptonshire Police, the Council is to conduct a speed survey early in the New Year. This will involve Councillors (and associates) being trained and using "speed guns" to try and catch offenders.

### **Vandalism**

Sadly, we do still have the odd spot of vandalism within our parish and we ask all of our residents to be vigilant and to dial 101 if they see anything suspicious, In recent weeks we have had to replace shrubs in one of our planters on Banbury Lane, after they were mysteriously stolen by person(s) unknown

We have also replaced the notice board near Pineham Lock after that was damaged and also installed a new seat near the post box after that was vandalised. Ultimately, the cost of repairing these items, falls upon you the Council Tax payer. We would however wish to thank our County Councillor Jill Hope for arranging for County Council funds to pay for the new bench.

# **Boundary Change**

At its meeting on 6th July, the Parish Council unanimously agreed to make application to extend its boundaries to include the new housing developments at Dragonfly / Butterfly Meadows. Formal application has now been made to the Borough Council. These new housing estates are currently within the Parish boundary of Upton but are separated from the rest of Upton by the river. It is believed that the needs of the new areas would be better served by joining with Hunsbury Meadows and that the parish of Hunsbury Meadows would benefit from the opportunity to provide community facilities that the new development would bring. We await developments on this application with great interest. Pineham Barnes School, although currently just outside our boundary, will serve both Hunsbury Meadows and Upton.

# Proposed Development – Upton Way / Banbury Lane

#### (Planning Application N/2015/0872)

The Parish Council has received notification that the application to build 34 dwellings on this site has been approved in principle by the Borough Council's Planning Committee (subject to Section 106 agreement) on 15th June 2016. The Parish Council will obviously be watching progress on this development with great interest and concern, particularly with regard to its traffic impact on the junction with Banbury Lane and the safety of our residents.
