# **Speeding on Banbury Lane**

The speed of traffic on Banbury Lane is probably the most raised issue on the Parish Council and the most concern of residents, particularly at school times. The Parish Council has decided to arrange a Community Speed Watch (CSW) on Banbury Lane. This will be carried out over a 6 week period during February and March 2017. There will be a secondary programme that will take place in June and July 2017.





The purpose of the programme is to show all those who live within the Parish, and vehicles passing through our Parish that speeding will not be tolerated. All information is then processed by Northamptonshire Police and offenders will receive a written warning.



# **Cycle Path**

Would residents please note that the path on the eastern side of Banbury Lane is also a designated cycle path. Would cyclists please use this for your own safety and would pedestrians please be prepared to give way.

### Parish Maintenance

Your Council has been active in recent weeks in arranging various items of maintenance.

1) The footpaths leading from Banbury Lane down the side of the canal bridge to the tow path have been resurfaced,

2) The willow trees overhanging the bus stop and street light at the northern end of Banbury Lane have been cut back,

3) The laurel trees on the east side of Banbury Lane have been trimmed,

4) A new dog bin has been installed on the towpath near the new playground,

#### Future Work Banbury Lane Playground

The Council is also preparing for the installation of new gates to Riverstone entrance to the children's playground on Banbury Lane and will be rehanging the gate at the other entrance.

The Council have also authorised further work on play equipment for our children.

1. The original climbing frames are to be refurbished and re-painted

2. The Council have purchased a Basketball ring and goalmouth, this will be installed along with an appropriate hard surface within the playground for older children and teenagers.

#### **Hedge Cutting**

The Council have a new programme of work with Amey to continue the work to control the brambles along side the Cycle Path on Banbury Lane. Also the hedgerows either side of the green space which runs parallel to the canal towpath and Ashpole Spinny/Samwell Way will be cut back and trimmed.

#### **CAR PARKING**

Could we, once again, plead with residents to be sensible about parking their cars. The Council receives regular complaints from residents on this subject. Wherever possible, please use garages, driveways and parking spaces provided. Please park commercial vehicles away from the estates. Remember that emergency vehicles must be able to get through. It is not acceptable just to leave a gap that a private car struggles to get by. The police will take action against offenders.

### **Council Website**



Just before Christmas the Parish Council approved the development of a new website using the services of a web design company specialising in the designing websites for Parish and Town Councils. Over the last couple of months, your Council, particularly the Chairman, have been creating the new website which can be found at www.hunsburymeadows.org.uk. Mr Watson from the school trust board was present at our last meeting and provided updates on the new school. The build is running on target for it's opening in September and the majority of it's new intake will be from our parish. As a parish council we will be looking to work closely with the school, Borough and County Councillors, and parents to address concerns about traffic, parking and dropping off on the roads around the school.

There have been one or two recent incidents of vandalism within our Parish, which is definitely not wanted. Could we please ask residents to keep their eyes open and call the police on 101 (999 if it's an emergency) if they see anything suspicious.

### **Litter Pick**

The Council is arranging another litter pick for the spring and has selected Saturday 8th April as the date. Please assemble in the children's playground on Banbury Lane at 10.30am.



Gloves and litter pickers will be provided. The more people who come along, the greater the area we can cover and the quicker it will take.

# **Party in the Park**

The Council notes the huge success of the Party in the Park last summer and has been considering its future, Arranging and paying for such an event is quite a major task for a small Council like ours and we have to be seen to be acting responsibly with, what is basically, your money. The Council has therefore provisionally decided that this might be a biennial event (every two year), The Council would welcome the views of residents on this, perhaps via the Website.

## **Canal Bridge**

The Council is most concerned for the safety of pedestrians crossing over the canal bridge. The footpaths leading up to the bridge end before linking to the narrow footpath on the bridge. This forces pedestrians to cross rough ground. Additionally the footpath on the bridge is extremely narrow and the passing traffic includes many heavy and large vehicles. The Parish Council is currently investigating with the County Council how this situation might be improved. However extending the footpaths will mean moving the traffic lights and reinforcing the embankments, if there is a solution it will be expensive and outside the remit of the Parish Council.

In the meantime, can we please urge pedestrians crossing the canal to take extra care.
